Processing of Personal Data Related to Course Administration at the Department of Sociology

In order to facilitate course administration (e.g. when selecting course modules or thesis subjects), the Department of Sociology collects personal data such as your name, social security number and e-mail address. This data is only stored until the selection process is finished and is deleted afterwards. The data will not be shared with parties outside of the administrative staff of the Department of Sociology, and by extension this means that it will not be shared to parties residing in countries outside of the EU. In this case the purpose behind our processing of personal data is, in accordance with your consent, to register the data we need to fulfill our duty as a governmental educational institution. This processing of data is always performed in accordance with current legislation.

The Department of Sociology continuously works on implementing all suitable technical and organizational measure to ensure that the processing of your personal data is conducted in accordance with the law.

Your Rights

When you have submitted personal data for processing, you always retain the right to withdraw your consent, as well as the right to adjust incorrect data. You have the right to demand a transcript of the personal data that you have submitted. Requests for transcripts are made to the university registrar (registrator@su.se).
